As testimony to the quality of Tim Jarvis, guest speaker at Operation Flinders fund raising breakfast at the Hilton on Thursday, Graham Holcroft said to me, 'He was the best speaker that I have ever heard'. Not wishing to readily agree with Graham I reflected on a lifetime of hearing motivation speakers but struggled to find one better than Tim; his delivery had inspiration and humour.

His topic was the doomed Shackleton Antarctic Expedition of 1914 and Ernest Shackleton's brilliance as an inspirational leader, which helped saved the lives of himself and crew.

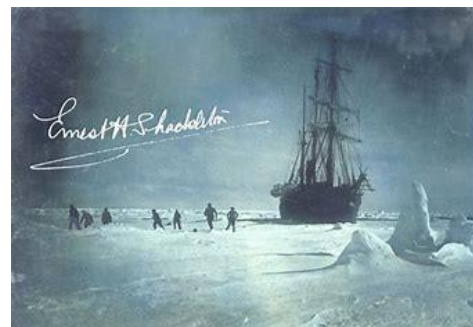
Shackleton's granddaughter wanted to replicate the perilous sea voyage of her grandfather, so she employed Tim Jarvis to build an identical boat and find a crew for this purpose. After 5 years of planning Tim and crew set out in 2015 and succeeded in matching the feat of Shackleton and crew 100 years earlier.

Every detail had to be identical, down to the inadequate clothing and poor navigational aids. Tim said that the secret of an ideal leader is to surround yourself with people who are better.
