It was a good discussion and most agreed that it is a good concept.




DISTRICT CONFERENCE – LOXTON – 15-17MARCH 2024

MAGILL SUNRISE MARKET BENEFICIARY - NEW DAWN



Funds from the Magill Sunrise Market in July will be donated to our humanitarian aid project in Ukraine.

The funding from Rotary Clubs in South Australia has enabled "New Dawn" volunteers to setup a modular Medical Centre in a town northeast of Kherson. The location was identified by local health authorities after the previous regional hospital was destroyed.

We will now be funding a hub of three Medical Centres to service the 10,000 population in this region.

The project team has also secured a Grant from Rotary International for Ukraine. This grant will help us establish a number of smaller aid projects in Odesa and the regional villages.

Thank you to everyone who attended and helped at the Magill Sunrise Market in July – and to District Chair Tim Mee for updates on the project.
