We were blessed with an abundance of interesting guest speakers at this week's meeting.

First up Harleen, Madeline and Kate from Mary MacKillop College spoke of their three-day Santos Science Experience held at Adelaide University.

Topics like engineering, insects, minerals, matchstick rockets, environment, Waite Campus, wine making, infectious diseases, DNA of Strawberries, were discussed. If

these three days didn't whet their STEM appetite, then nothing will.

Best of luck girls with whatever branch of science you decide on in the future.

Next, Sharon and Leanne from the Epilepsy Centre SA and NT spoke about their association. Yes,

we had heard some of their presentation just a few weeks earlier, but they did bring along some equipment that has been a god-send to families with a member/s with epilepsy; items like the seizure mat and the anti-suffocation pillow which have enabled parents to sleep soundly, knowing that if a child has a seizure this equipment will prevent a death.

The ladies also explained how they can spend time with families explaining issues that a medical specialist cannot afford to give. Our Club was able to fund these items by a \$1,200 donation to the Epilepsy Centre with money raised from our market and Coin Slider.

QUIZ QUESTION

When did Rotary International launch its global effort to immunize the world's children against Polio?

ANSWER:

Rotary launched PolioPlus in 1985, followed by the establishment of the Global Polio Rotary launched PolioPlus Eradication Initiative in 1988.

In the 1980's polio paralysed more than 1,000 children worldwide every day (more than 350,000 people a year).

Since then, more than 2.5 billion children have been immunized against polio; wild poliovirus continues to circulate in only two countries and the global incidence of polio cases has decreased by 99.99%

Rotary has contributed more than \$2 billion and countless volunteer hours to immunize more than three billion children around the world
