Peter explained where ShelterBox is assisting around the world and showed us what goods were packaged and sent for emergency disaster relief. I really liked the solar light.

During the meeting the club was delighted to be presented with a **ShelterBox Bronze Champion Award**. This award is given to a Rotary club who has committed to making an ongoing impact in worldwide disaster response by supporting ShelterBox with a gift of \$1,000.00 annually for **three consecutive financial years.**

ShelterBox is an international disaster relief charity with a mission to provide emergency shelter and other aid items to families around the world who have lost their homes due to disaster or conflict and thus enabling affected families to rebuild their lives.

The **Rotary Club of Magill Sunrise** will continue to support ShelterBox as natural and other disasters are inevitable and frequent, and the need is continuous. Right now, more than 100 million people around the world have been made homeless by circumstances thrust upon them.

It is you, our supporters at our monthly market, that enables us to contribute to good causes. When you buy a sausage, a fritter, a bacon and egg sandwich or drop coins into the Coin Slider, it ends up **transforming despair into HOPE** somewhere in the world.

GUEST SPEAKER – PETER JARVIS

RC of Berri's Peter Jarvis was our guest speaker. Peter is the District Representative for ShelterBox and has had this role since 2000, so he knows his stuff.

Peter has been his club president on three occasions and is also heavily involved in Youth Exchange. Peter started today with a video which quickly acted as a refresher on the topic. The figures for world homeless is around 100 million and it is the aim of Shelter Box to hit at least 1 million with supply of shelter boxes and paraphernalia.

ShelterBox commenced in English town of Helston Lizard in Cornwall, situated on the Lizard Peninsula. ShelterBox, although global, is controlled centrally from the UK and Rotary International is a partner/affiliate.

In the early days whenever a significant natural disaster occurred standard shelter boxes would be sent, irrespective if 100% of the content was relevant to the recipients.

Nowadays, a ShelterBox assessment team will first visit the disaster site and then make recommendations to HQ as to the needs of the people. For example, a shelter kit (consisting mainly of tools) will only cost one tenth of a complete shelter box, providing 10 kits to needy families rather

one super deluxe shelter box.

There are many varieties of boxes; some contain water purifiers, others solar powered lamps that can double as mobile phone recharger; they also reduce the chance of fires. Most of the boxes are now eco-friendly, with limited use of plastics.

Another advancement is the use of vouchers. People are given vouchers to obtain goods and services that ShelterBox has arranged with traders and utilities.

Hang straps with adjustable snaps to hang anywhere or carry by hand

High efficiency solar panel for recharging

Waterproof and can float Packs flat for storage

24 hour LED light - multiple days of light on flashing

The content of boxes is designed with the weather conditions in mind; mosquito nets for the tropics, blankets for colder regions, etc.

ShelterBox has expanded its services beyond natural disaster and now include war zones and hot spots. Where possible ShelterBox will employ locals to provide the equipment that fills the boxes. This is the case with a group of women in the Philippines who have gone from being in need to providing back to ShelterBox.

When Peter is not into all things Rotary, he's a permanent relief teacher.

Peter is seen presenting our Club President with our Bronze Award for hitting the \$1,000 donation to ShelterBox for three consecutive years.







QUIZ QUESTION

Which of the following major cities is further north: Beijing, Tokyo, Seattle, Toronto or Budapest?

ANSWER: SEATTLE.

I thought this would be an interesting question as the mind usually switches to think which is the coldest place, so Beijing, Toronto & Budapest were the main guesses. Quite surprisingly, the answer is Seattle at 4,715km from the North Pole, which is only about 1,500km more than the distance from Perth to Sydney. Through geographic quirks it has nowhere near the cold winters of the other cities with a relatively mild average daytime temperature of 8C in December & January. Toronto is about 400km further south and averages 0C in January & February for example. Budapest is just 10km further south than Seattle at 4,725km from the Pole, then Toronto (5,153km), Beijing (5,567km) and Tokyo (6,041km).




























LOCHEND HOUSE OPEN DAY - SUNDAY 4 AUGUST 2024

Who is Eligible?

RYPEN is open to all young people aged 14 to 17 years who have an ambition to improve their interpersonal and leadership skills.

Details in Brief

- When / Where: RYPEN is held at Nunyara Conference Centre between Fri 1 Nov and Sun 3 Nov 2024.
- How to register: Any young person aged 14-17 can register their interest at www.rypen9510.org
- Applications are due: Monday 14 October 2024.
- RYPEN costs: Around \$425, but most young people will attend at no cost, fully sponsored by Rotary. Rotary Clubs may request a \$50 holding deposit which is fully refundable when the young person attends RYPEN.
- School involvement: Encourage young people to apply. Once a young person registers, Rotary finds a local Rotary Club to sponsor the applicant.
- Rotary involvement: Based on each applicant's registration details, their local Rotary Club will contact the student directly. The club may interview the applicant and ask to interview the applicant.
- Child Protection: RYPEN facilitators are aged between 19 and 24, have attended Rotary leadership training, have their Working With Children Check (WWCC) and have been vetted for suitability by Rotary.
