# **QUIZ QUESTION**

Apologies for another question related to America, but the shocking events of the weekend steered me in a new direction. Unfortunately, we all know that the USA has a long history of violence against their leaders and four Presidents have been assassinated in their history. Lesser know is that three have now been wounded in assassination attempts including Donald Trump. Who were the other two?

#### **ANSWER:**

Pretty much everyone knew Ronald Reagan, but none knew that Theodore Roosevelt was also a victim, shot in the chest while campaigning in 1912. The bullet was slowed by his folded speech and his metal glasses case but did penetrate his chest where it remained for the rest of his life. He defiantly continued his speech and instructed the police that no harm must come to the perpetrator, John Schrank. Schrank was found mentally insane and was committed to an institution until his death 30 years later.

Reagan's attacker John Hinckley Jr was inspired to kill the President by the film Taxi Driver where he became obsessed with Jodie Foster and wanted to impress her. He had originally been targeting Jimmy Carter, but then took to Regan in 1981 firing six shots with only one bullet hitting him. Hinckley was also found mentally insane and committed to an institution coincidentally also for 30 years until his death. There have been 39 other attempts to assassinate Presidents dating back to 1835. The most were against Obama with eight, followed by Clinton five, with Trump and Ford now equal on three 3. GW Bush, Carter, Nixon, Truman, Franklin Roosevelt, Taft & Lincoln had two each.

**Responses:** Fortunately, the discussion was very civil, and dogs just narrowly beat cats as the preferred pets. 
The **Stobie Pole**, a South Australian icon, was patented by James Cyril Stobie on the 15<sup>th of</sup> July 1924.





RYPEN is a three-day residential program of enrichment for young people aged 14 to 17.

The program aims to provide opportunities for young people to develop important life-skills, and to assist them to progress their communication and leadership skills through a range of formal and informal activities.

#### Activities

Participants take part in a range of activities including:

- Ice-breakers
- Comedy skits
- Discussion forums Workshops
- · Small group work
- Career expos

#### Personal Development

Experienced young facilitators will support and encourage participants in the program to develop their:

- Public speaking skills
   Self-care and resilience
   Communication skills

- Teamwork
- Problem-solving Skills
- Beliefs and values

Goal setting

RYPEN'S focus is on assisting young people to become active and valuable members of society, and to develop their abilities as potential leaders.

Participants can seize the opportunity to develop leadership, communication and problem-solving skills, practice new behaviours, forge life-long friendships and challenge their personal belief systems and values.

RYPEN is open to all young people aged 14 to 17 years who have an ambition to improve their interpersonal and leadership skills.

#### **Details in Brief**

- . When / Where: RYPEN is held at Nunyara Conference Centre between Fri 1 Nov and Sun 3 Nov 2024.
- How to register: Any young person aged 14-17 can register their interest at www.rypen9510.org
- Applications are due: Monday 14 October 2024.
- . RYPEN costs: Around \$425, but most young people will attend at no cost, fully sponsored by Rotary. Rotary Clubs may request a \$50 holding deposit which is fully refundable when the young person attends RYPEN.
- School involvement: Encourage young people to apply. Once a young person registers, Rotary finds a local Rotary Club to sponsor the applicant.
- . Rotary involvement: Based on each applicant's registration details, their local Rotary Club will contact the student directly. The club may interview the applicant and ask to interview the applicant.
- Child Protection: RYPEN facilitators are aged between 19 and 24, have attended Rotary leadership training, have their Working With Children Check (WWCC) and have been vetted for suitability by Rotary.


