# **GUEST SPEAKER – CHRIS DE LA RUE**

When our scheduled guest speaker couldn't make it to this week's club meeting Chris De La Rue stepped up.

Chris is Proprietor and Head Brewer of **Eclectic Brewing Campbelltown**. Eclectic is a Home Base Brewery; all home-based businesses have a legislated floor space and Eclectic just fulfils that requirement.

But why the name Eclectic? A quick quiz amongst members left most struggling to come up with a definition but one definition says it's an adjective meaning 'deriving ideas, style or taste from a broad and diverse range of sources.

The name made sense when Chris listed his various occupations that began as butcher, through to Commonwealth mission planner and satellite programmer, Commonwealth security adviser, operations manager Juvenile Justice NSW, manager background screening checks, SA and manger licence regulations, SA, it naturally followed that Chris would want to own his own brewery. He finally managed to pull this off turning 60.

Chris' quest for brewing began in 2012 in Tumut NSW, but fate stepped in, and that idea was abandoned. Chris' partner, Leonie, was living in Adelaide and preparing to move to Tumut, so Chris moved to Adelaide and has remained ever since. Fate stepped in again Chris and Leonie were sampling the wares at a boutique brewery and then made a spur of the moment to purchase redundant brewing equipment and voila, Eclectic was born.

After a disaster with canning equipment being transported from Queensland, canned beer finally came off the assembly line in April of this year. In July this year Eclectic took out gold, silver and bronze for three of its beers at the Adelaide Beer and BBQ Festival. The names of those beers were Campbelltowner, Kayak and Jeepney.

This subeditor sampled Jeepney at this months' Magill Market. It has a touch of mango and I highly recommend it.

Chris told us that Adelaide tap water is unsuitable for brewing and his water goes through Reverse Osmosis before adding his magic.

# **QUIZ QUESTION**

The Riverland has several places named with Aboriginal names, such as Berri, Barmera, Renmark & Paringa. Some were also named after people, such as Loxton, Morgan, Cadell and Kingston. Right in the middle is Lake Bonney that almost all South Australians have visited at some stage, but how did it get its name?

### Was it:

- An Aboriginal word that sounded a bit like an English word?
- Named after a place in Scotland?
- Named by a Scot who thought it "looked bonny"?
- Named after a person?

# **ANSWER:**

It was named after a person. Charles Bonney (1813-1897) was born in England. After migrating to Australia in 1834 he became a successful drover moving large herds of cattle & sheep around NSW and Victoria, including discovering and opening up the fertile plains around Kilmore, Vic. He was then involved in the first overland cattle drive from NSW to SA in 1838 led by Joseph Hawdon. On the way they came by Lake Victoria, which Hawdon named for the newly crowned Queen. A bit further along they encountered Lake Bonney, which Hawdon named for his young offsider Charles, but he recorded the Aboriginal names as "Nookampka".

Hawdon himself doesn't appear to have anything significant named after him despite this important foundational contribution to the SA colony, but there is a Hawdon St in Barmera. On the journey they also encountered several hostile Aboriginal groups and Bonney found that playing his flute intrigued them and calmed the situation.

Bonney went back and did another successful cattle drive from Victoria on the south side of the river, which meant he had to somehow cross the Murray River with the herd as there was no bridge. He did so with the loss of just one head.

After that he settled in SA and being very well educated, became a Magistrate and Commissioner of Crown Lands in 1842. He ran for Parliament and was elected to the House of Assembly for the seat of East Torrens, which at that time included Magill. He then returned to England for a few years and upon his return became a Member of the SA Legislative Council and ended his career as the Manager of SA Railways. In 1885 he moved to Sydney where he lived the rest of his life.

Interestingly, Barmera is probably the name the Aboriginals called the lake and between 1908 and 1913 it was actually renamed "Lake Barmera", but then changed back. Lake Bonney in the south east of SA was also named for Charles. In 1981 the Barmera Council campaigned to have the one in the south east completely renamed to avoid confusion. That was mostly rejected, but the Barmera one officially became "Lake Bonney Riverland" and the other became "Lake Bonney SE". Since 2014 it was officially co-named as "Lake Bonney Riverland / Barmera".
