Our newly minted member, Godfrey Sibanda, presented his "Behind the Badge" at our club meeting.

Godfrey was born into poverty in Zimbabwe, just after Zimbabwe's Unilateral Declaration of Independence (UDI) from Rhodesian rule.

Godfrey explained the issues that his grandmother experienced as a 'coloured' born of a white father and a black mother. Rhodesia practiced an apartheid system like neighbouring South Africa (RSA). Godfrey has an elder brother who appears 'coloured' which immediately divides a family.

Godfrey grew up in a remote part of Zimbabwe near the RSA border with seven siblings. Due to the kindness of others his primary education was paid for. This led to him completing secondary and tertiary education.

Godfrey's siblings have also led successful lives in fields like education, medicine and education. Once Godfrey qualified as a doctor, he married Siza and then moved back to the small village that he grew up in, but now serving the community in its hospital.

After four years in that hospital, he, Siza and family spent another seven years at a health service near Victoria Falls. Treating the eyes of the wife of a visiting ENT specialist who lived in Victoria, Australia, led to Godfrey and family moving to Australia and Adelaide.

Godfrey's aged mother flies out to visits Godfrey and siblings who also live in Australia. There are four who remain in Zimbabwe.

Godfrey and Siza both enjoy hiking (locally and internationally). He is also a keen photographer and showed us one of his favourite shots of a flowering weed. He drew the analogy that as a child he too was a weed, who was given the chance to bloom. This also explains why Godfrey wants to help children in Zimbabwe who also need a chance to bloom, and his role as director of Aid for Africa Down Under (AFADA). Godfrey currently works at Hindmarsh Bowden Health.

QUIZ QUESTION

We are meeting within the State seat of Hartley, where Vincent Tarzia is our local member and now Leader of the Opposition. Who was Hartley?

ANSWER: John Anderson Hartley (1844-1896) was a noted educator in SA credited with establishing the Primary-Secondary-Tertiary education system and the concept of Public Exams. He was born and schooled in England emigrating to SA in 1871 where he took up the role of Head Master at the newly formed Prince Alfred College that had around 100 students. After growing the student population to 150, he departed in 1875 to become President of the SA Council of Education. That body was abolished in 1879, and he was appointed head of the SA Education Department.

His somewhat revolutionary thinking about education was challenged by many, which in 1881 resulted in a Royal Commission into the education system. He was exonerated and he was highly commended for his approach and went on to make public education free in SA from 1892. He was engaged in 1872 as part of the formation committee for the University of Adelaide and from its inception in 1874 he had been on the governing Council. In 1893 he was appointed Vice Chancellor and in 1895 was part of the formation of Roseworthy

Council. In 1893 he was appointed Vice Chancellor and in 1895 was part of the formation of Roseworthy College. He was killed in a tragic cycling accident in 1896 at the age of just 52.

A person who left a very large mark on the formation of South Australia as we know it. Mark provided the correct answer based on remembering that what is now the Magill Campus of Uni SA was briefly named Hartley College from 1980-82.

Let's make an impact and get behind this walk. Show Adelaide we care.












Green Corner – Battery recycling

We are consuming more batteries than ever. With the increase in renewable energy sources, we are consuming more of our trusty rechargeable batteries. All batteries have a limited life, after which they need to be disposed of. The latest battery chemistries have very high energy density and can be a serious hazard with respect to fire, toxicity, and biohazard. We are routinely hearing about



fires in rubbish trucks and recycling plants, and about children who are seriously injured after ingesting button batteries.



B-cycle (https://bcycle.com.au) is Australia's official battery recycling scheme. On this website you can find your nearest recycling site, such as the local shopping centre. But to improve safety in recycling they are making some new recommendations, including this link: TAPING BATTERIES SAVES LIVES. Taping the battery terminals stops the batteries shorting out, heating up and potentially causing a

catastrophic fire. In addition, taping button batteries, reduces the likelihood of serious injury after being ingested. Check out the <u>website</u> for advice and how-to videos on making the disposal of batteries safer for everyone.

B-cycle goes beyond recycling, and addresses the sourcing of a safe and sustainable battery industry, in seeking to create a full circular battery economy.
























RYDA - ROTARY YOUTH DRIVER AWARENESS



The RYDA Programme (or Road Safety Education - RSE) is a Rotary initiative that aims to deliver coordinated, updated and practical road safety information to school students who have recently or are in the process of obtaining their driving license.

The Programme which is run by Road Safety Education (RSE) engages local community experts to complement the school road safety curriculum and to provide an opportunity for 15 and 16-year-old students to access additional road safety resources not available within schools.


The key aim is to influence the attitude of young people and inform them of their responsibilities when driving or riding in a vehicle, thereby assisting our community in achieving a reduction in deaths and injuries on our roads.

The programme is conducted over a one-day period, during school time at the ARC.

The Programme comprises six separate presentations including presentations by Police, Brain injury Association, Rights and responsibilities for young drivers, Hazards and distractions, Speed and stopping, Effects and consequences of alcohol and drugs.

This valuable day was organised for Charles Campbell College students by Morialta Rotary Club with assistance from neighbouring clubs including ours.

Once again Mark Thompson, a trained presenter, stepped up to the plate and represented the Rotary Club of Magill Sunrise.






