

### **GUEST SPEAKER: JACKSON PAWELSKI**

Our guest speaker this week was Jackson Pawelski, Youth Engagement Community Officer Scouts SA.

Jackson is one of the very few full-time paid employees of Scouts SA, having risen through the ranks from a 10-year-old cub, scout, adventurer and Queen's scout.

Jackson's journey began while he was playing, he found his dad's scout's uniform hidden in a cupboard and wanted to know more. Jackson described his journey in scouting as nothing outstanding, but just hanging in there and taking opportunities as they were presented.

He told us of some of the Jamboree weather disasters that made them more resilient; nothing goes to plan, so work your way around it.


In 2019 scouting in Australia made changes where 5 levels of scouting only had one program. Tests for elevation in the organisation are now set by individuals rather than having to fulfil criteria set by Scouts SA.

There are around 4,000 scouts in SA. Numbers have fallen, but it's no longer a revolving door and members stick.

In 2025 the 26<sup>th</sup> Australian Jamboree will be held in Maryborough, Queensland in January whilst the international jamboree will be at the Appalachian Experience in West Virginia, which will be a mega event.

### Who am I/what am I best known for?

- 1. I was born on this day (10<sup>th</sup> September) in 1844 in England
- 2. My wife Elizabeth and I emigrated to Australian in 1865 and settled in Melbourne
- 3. I became an orchardist and started making and selling jams & pickles made with produce from my orchard under the "Rising Sun" brand
- 4. In 1889 I opened a factory in South Melbourne and in 1892 sent my first shipment of products to England with great results
- 5. By 1895 business had grown substantially and had also branched into confectionery, so the business moved into a new 5 story factory in South Melbourne
- 6. In 1909 I introduced milk chocolate products to my business
- 7. In 1910 I sold the jam and preserves side of the business to the Henry Jones Cooperative Ltd (IXL), but retained the confectionery business
- 8. In 1913 I moved to the Barrackville factory and started naming my products "Barrackville Cocoa and Chocolate" possibly countering Cadbury's famous Bourneville brand
- 9. When packing my chocolates I started inserting an unusual treat with them, but it was sticky and tended to absorb water from the air and stick to things, so in 1913 I decided to dip it in chocolate to overcome these issues. This became a new product in its own right
- 10. I was looking for a name for my new product and had come up with a simple name, but that name was trademarked so I decided to use my wife's favourite flower as the primary name
- 11. I died in 1918, but some of my 14 children continued to run the company
- 12. In 1960 a new product named Bertie Beetle was invented to use up the wasted material from production
- 13. In 1970 the company I founded was sold to a rival company, Rowntree, who were subsequently taken over by Nestle in 1989
- 14. In 2009 Nestle changed the shape of the bar to be wider and flatter, plus changed the formula so the main component would shatter into small pieces when bitten
- 15. The changes were disastrous, and the product popularity rapidly declined, so Nestle cancelled production in 2010
- 16. In 2012 a descendant of mine attempted to regain the name, recipe rights and equipment to start production again, but failed
- 17. In 2018 Robern Menz in Adelaide announced that they had secured the rights to the name, recipe and equipment and would begin production again
- 18. In 2019 my famous product re-appeared on the shelves of Australian supermarkets

### **Answer:** I am Abel Hoadley, and the product is the Violet Crumble.

Lots of good guesses along the way, but Colin was the winner at question 10 and took home the chocolates literally!






### **ICE BREAKER**
