PRESIDENT'S REPORT

October is a busy month in Rotary as it not only focuses on mental health but also Polio.

In her **World Polio Day** message, Rotary

International President Stephanie Urchick calls upon the Rotary community to build on our incredible progress, face the challenges ahead with tenacity, and stay focused on our ultimate goal: a polio-free world.

World Polio Day is on the 24th **October** and was established by Rotary International to commemorate the birth of Jonas Salk, who led the first team to develop a vaccine against poliomyelitis.

The fact polio raised its ugly head in Gaza some months back is worrying especially as it was thought to be contained everywhere except for two countries. It shows the world needs to be vigilant against this disease.

Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years and despite the local outbreak in Gaza the goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever.

Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries from this paralysing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort.

It is crucial to continue working to keep all countries polio-free. If all eradication efforts stopped today, within 10 years, polio could paralyse as many as 200,000 children each year.

Community Group 3 covers the 13 Rotary Clubs of Blackwood, Burnside, Campbelltown, Coromandel Valley, Eastwood, Edwardstown, Hyde Park, Mitcham, Morialta, Norwood, St Peters, Unley and last but not least, Magill Sunrise.

What do we have in common? Lots! and particularly a common desire for Rotary to do better with Membership, Public Image, Communication and Fundraising.

So, after an analysis of where each club stood, this Workshop looked at areas or activities that we would like to collectively focus on.

The following image was used to help the group evaluate how to choose the best option/s. However, it is a really useful guide to what is important for our organisation's growth.



The workshop moved into a Brainstorming session, then Reviewed and Assessed those ideas to select what people would like to focus on for their club's development.

However, the workshop stopped short of a Final Selection knowing the Growth Plan requires strong club and member engagement.

So, this presentation was the 1st step in asking members what they like – and why? Pauline and Lindsay will take the results back to the next Community Group workshop to be joined by other Clubs to produce actions that will increase our impact, extend our reach into the community, maintain or improve member satisfaction and be relevant for the role of volunteers in today's world.

Locally it seems we are lucky that we have an even spread of supermarkets Aldi, Drakes, Foodland, Woolworths and Coles, plus some excellent other local stores such as Tony & Marks and Panini Brothers, both of whom support our Market. Coles and Woolies have been getting a fairly bad rap recently. So, what is your favourite local store, and do you have a view on the Coles and Woolies saga?

Responses:

Probably because we do have a good local mix of stores, most felt that there was no particular favourite and tended to shop at their easiest local store regardless of "brand". There also didn't seem to be too much concern about the Coles and Woolies issues covered by the media and it didn't affect local shopping habits. It was noted that the Coles at Burnside Village seems to have better specials than the local Coles stores though, which was an interesting observation.

Fun facts about Woolies:

- 1. Completely unrelated to the US company of the same name, but did copy the name from the US which wasn't trademarked in Australia at the time
- 2. Started 1924 in Sydney and opened its second store in Brisbane August 1927
- 3. Pioneer radio advertisers from 1937
- 4. First self-serve stores introduced in 1955
- 5. The first dedicated food store opened in Sydney in 1957
- 6. The number of stores hit 300 in 1959
- 7. In 1959 the first supermarket was opened
- 8. Woolworths' own brands were launched in 1973
- 9. The first Big W was opened in 1976
- 10. In 1981 they acquired a controlling share of Dick Smith Electronics and in 2001 acquired Tandy Electronics
- 11. Acquired 126 Safeway stores in 1985
- 12. Adopted the tag of "The Fresh Food People" in 1987
- 13. Moved into the Leisure & Hospitality business in 2004
- 14. Acquired Woolworths NZ in 2005 (from Foodland!)
- 15. In 2018 they voluntarily banned plastic bags in Woolworths and BigW across Australia

After the walk stay and enjoy the Rotary Club of Magill Market











