GUEST SPEAKER – ALICE JOSAF

One of our club's most recent members, Alice Josaf, presented her "Person 'Behind the Badge'. Alice was born in Jakarta, capital of Indonesia on 26 June 1977.

Alice told us the significance of this day; not so much that it was her day of birth, but it was the day the Elvis performed his last concert before his untimely death.

Alice was one of four siblings, growing up in a happy household. Being a lover of animals she had plenty of pets provided by her grandfather who would capture or find them in the bush.

Winning a bet with her parents, she chose to be sent to Singapore at age 14 to continue with her secondary schooling. Be careful what you wish for because initially Alice was very homesick.

In 1995 Alice came to Adelaide to complete year 12 at Marion High (coincidentally President Pauline's old alma mater). After Year 12 Alice commenced her degree in mechanical and manufacturing engineering, but after two years she had to pull out because of financial circumstance back in Indonesia.

Alice then spent two years as a waitress before resuming studies, this time swapping to physiotherapy, which she practices. Alice is married to Martin, and they have two children, Annabel and Nikolas. They love to travel with their children (Alice says money that should go to the mortgage goes on travel).



Her travels have also taken Alice to Chikombedzi, Zimbabwe, where she supports the local community, school and Lirhanzo Children's Village and sponsors nine-year-old Mercy.

Assisting the school is the next project for our club. Alice and fellow club member Godfrey both are members of AFADU (Aid for Africa Down Under) and Godfrey is on the Board of Directors.

Alice finished her presentation by telling us her credo for life which she picked up from her English Literature teacher at Marion High; 'I can, I will, I want to'. Thank you, Alice.

Magill Sunrise Rotary members are extremely proud to be recognised for achieving those goals, especially as we were only one of ten clubs in the district to achieve this milestone.










PRESIDENT'S - "DID YOU KNOW?"

The Walk:






